WE'RE MOVING UP THE AVENUE! Moving Day for Piedmont Avenue Branch Library

We expect our beloved library to close in February 2012 and to reopen on the grounds of the Piedmont Avenue Elementary School (4314 Piedmont Ave). There will be no library services for the brief moving and set up period.

In 2009, Citibank, who had been renting the building to our Library, sold the library building. Citibank had charged a token rent of \$1 a month; the new landlord, Neil Goodhue, raised the rent in 2010 to \$4,250 a month.

There is no money in the city's budget to pay this amount for rent.

After considering a number of options the Library recommended that the Piedmont Avenue Branch Library move to a modular building located on the grounds of Piedmont Avenue Elementary School.

The modular building will be slightly larger than our current library, will be ADA compliant, and

have air conditioning and a restroom. Our rent to the Oakland Unified School District will be \$2,000 to \$2,500 per month. The rent, build out, and move, will be paid by Measure Q Funds.

To complete the move to the school grounds the Library must finalize a five year lease agreement with the Oakland Unified School District and receive approval from the School Board and the City Council. Our community may need to attend some of these meetings to show our support for the library. We will send notices of any action via the PANIL and Piedmont Ave FOPL email lists.

Housing the library in the modular is a temporary, 5-10 year solution. When the economy improves, more options, including establishing a Mello-Roos tax district will be considered.

BIKE LANES ON THE AVENUE? Piedmont Avenue Bike Lane Project

Jason Patton from the City of Oakland's bike project spoke at a recent PANIL meeting about proposed bike lanes on the Avenue.

Mr. Patton advised the proposed bike lanes on the Avenue are part of the city's bicycle master plan that was adopted in 1999. The width of the Avenue is 52 feet from curb to curb. The proposal calls for: two traffic lanes — 12 feet/each, two parking lanes — 8 feet/each, and two bikes lanes — 6 feet/each, and is scheduled for 2012 when the street is to be resurfaced from MacArthur Blvd. to Pleasant Vallev Road. Total cost is estimated at \$500K for the resurfacing and \$7K to set off the bike lanes.
